Jan started quilting 14 years ago and was involved in a quilt guild in Colorado Springs but she knew there was a big guild in Wichita, KS. They moved to Sedgwick, built a studio and started a longarm quilting business. One of the first things they did was attend a meeting of Prairie Quilt Guild. Jan began entering quilt shows 10 years ago, about the same time as the move to Kansas. As of this writing (the day after the "Bee" Tea) there were two new groups formed and a third that is looking for new members.



Library Lines

I have spent a lot of my summer visiting family, and one thing I have learned is that super-powers are not just something featured in summer block-buster movies. Here at the Prairie Quilt Guild we all share a super-power... We can sew! My family was intrigued not only by my quilts, but more particularly by the purses that I make. Do not underestimate your powers ladies and gents! The ability to sew is by no means universal, and you can create many an item to gift or maybe just to provoke envy (Do you always use your powers for good?).

The library has the several books that specialize in gifts and purses or bags. *Kokoro No Te: Handmade Treasure from the Heart* by Kumiko Sudo receives 4 ½ stars out of 5 on Amazon, and *Quilter's World* says, "These projects are elegant and send a message of love." While the photographs in this book are beautiful, some reviewers mention that the patterns are not for beginners as not all the steps are illustrated or explained completely.

It's a Wrap: Sewing Fabric Purses, Baskets and Bowls by Susan Breier features projects that use a technique of wrapping strips of fabric around clothesline and sewing them together to create a number of items. Reviewers of the author's previous

books which also feature this technique describe how easy it is to create beautiful bowls and other objects. One reviewer even said that the ugliest fabric looks fabulous with the wrapping technique. This sounds like a fun way to use up leftover strips and scraps of fabric.

This is our last column of the fiscal year and as such, we wanted to give you some of our library usage statistics. It has been an odd year what with the fire and our statistics reflect that. In December, only 36 items were checked out. This was also the first month after the fire and those 36 items were almost one third of the available items that month. I would count that as a win! The month with

the greatest number of items checked out was May with 137. This was the month that we asked you to help us "move" our mini library. Again, thank you!

This year our average monthly check-out is about 75 items. Since returning to the Senior Center and to our complete library collection, our numbers are up. In July, 102 items were checked out and we hope to equal that from here on. Come see if there is a book or magazine that you would like to read this month.

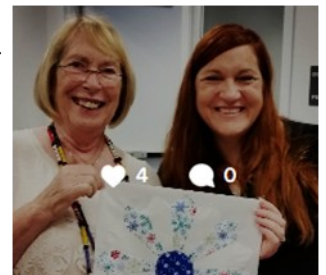

PQB Board of Directors Actions

The Board of Directors took the following actions during their August meeting.

Show & Share Photos

The Guild's website is being moved to a new hosting site and will be updated to a more user-friendly programming base at the same time. There are 10 years of Show & Share photos on our current website. Because transferring these photos is both time consuming and difficult, the Board decided to transfer only the 2014-2015 photos to the new server and to begin accumulating photos into the future from that point.

Just a reminder -

Doors open to members and visitors at noon and again at 6 pm, one hour before our guild meetings begin. Our speaker, board members and committee chairs are busy setting up and preparing for the meeting.

In addition, the Board will ask our web master, Dee Dunlap, to transfer the accumulated photos into a retrievable electronic format – CD, flash drive, etc. – if possible.

Recommendations to the New President.

In discussing the website, electronic media and publicity issues, the Board agreed on several recommendations to the new President.

Revive the role of Historian with a job description that requires the person appointed to be technologically proficient.

Initiate a newsletter column titled "In the News" which would relay any print, TV, radio, or social media Guild references to the membership

Appoint a Social Media Chair to coordinate the Guild's presence on Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Google+, etc. To assure continuity, the position should be a multi-year term, much like that of the webmaster.
