

Library Lines

I'm excited about a new book we have in our library. The Ultimate Guide to Machine Quilting: Long-Arm and Sit-Down by long-arm expert, Angela Walters, and home-sewing machine specialist, Christa Watson. These authors walk us through their design processes as they tackle the same quilt tops. They describe what quilting patterns and motifs are best suited for each method of quilting. The pages in this book are color coded for each author, so you can tell at a glance if you are looking at a tip for or example of a long-arm quilted top or a home sewing machine quilted top. This book includes ten quilt patterns and all the tips and inspiration you need to start or improve your home machine quilting and/or your long-arm quilting.

You may have noticed that the library carts look neater, and that it is easier to find the book you are looking for. Well, Olivia and I have finally finished implementing a bar code system for inventory purposes. As part of



this process, we weeded out many of our duplicate books and older books that hadn't been checked out in years. We still have plenty of books, but now you can find what you want easier, and of course we can put books away much easier too. Some of you benefited from the weeding process at the last library sale, and for those that missed it, we have plenty left over for the next sale. We have implemented a new bar code system particularly for inventory, which will make this job much quicker and easier in the future. This program also tells us that we currently have 1663 books available with a value of \$32,429.71, magazines are not included. We think the library is a great asset for the guild and these numbers back that up!


Our Visitor/Renewal Policy






Assembly Instructions

4) Assemble 4 patch to complete Block as shown in diagram at top.
