Rob Appell



Rob Appell blends his love for the ocean with his work as a textile artist and designer. A few years back, Rob landed a job in his mother's quilt shop "The Cotton Ball" in Morro Bay, California. It was at The Cotton Ball where Rob found a fondness for Hawaiian shirt making. Shirt scraps make beautiful quilts, and so does Rob. He learned to quilt by trial and error, and

definitely brings a masculine touch to this age old tradition. Rob's quilts are 100% machine made and focus on applique work.

Now, after almost twenty years in the industry, Rob designs Quilts for Michael Miller Fabrics, has authored a few books, countless quilt patterns including The Endangered Species Quilt Project, produced a few DVDs on his techniques, is inventing sewing and quilting tools, and services sewing machines in his studio in Morro Bay, California.

He has taped for both Simply Quilts and Uncommon Threads and The Quilt Show, and thought things were just beginning to get off the ground for him. Then came The Missouri Star Quilt Company and an offer to partner on the Man Sewing project. Life is only getting better for him. He is blessed to travel the world sharing his experiences and joy in quilt making and sewing machine technology. This is what he says on his blog:

Hi, I'm Rob Appell, host of Man Sewing. I'm a guy with boundless energy and enthusiasm for life and creativity. I love God, my wife, son and daughter. I enjoy waking up excited each day to see what lies ahead. I'm happiest when I'm outside or in my studio. I have been told that I inspire others and for that I feel very blessed.

President's Notes

I am late in saying Happy New Year to all of you. I have had a really hard December and January. It all started 12/19 with back pain that I know so well as kidney stones. I arrived at the ER thinking a little lipotripsy, a day or two at the most and all would be well. After having a CT scan they determined that my kidney stone was blocking the output from my kidney. This blockage caused my kidney to become infected and I had sepsis. They then put a nephrostomy tube in my back for drainage and to control the infection. I spent 4 days in ICU before another 4 days in regular room where I spiked a high fever 103.8. Needless to say I was a sick girl. I went home with the nephrostomy tube in my back and I still have the kidney stone. Once my infection was gone I had lithotripsy not lipotripsy. I came home feeling like I'd been beat to death and still have the nephrostomy tube. Today, 1/14/18 I feel better. I go back the 23rd and hopefully get rid of my tube.

I'd like to give a big thank you to Eleanor Malone for so graciously donating her quilting stash to our guild. Eleanor has moved to an assisted living community and has sold her home. On 12/16 my husband and I went to Eleanor's home. We helped her son-in-law go through her massive stash and brought home 2 pick up loads of various quilting fabrics and notions. It will be distributed to the various committees as soon as I feel stronger. I contacted Sue Gilliam, our librarian to go and pull any books that we could use in the library and Mary Avery who is on the committee for selling books and magazines at the quilt show. Then Mayleen Vinson picked up the rest. I'd like to thank you girls for your help in helping out Eleanor's family. I was pleasantly surprised to find out that Eleanor loved doing some of the things I too enjoy.

Thank you to Kendra McBroom, Linda Beachy-Hughes and Lora Lagree for sharing some of your quilting knowledge with the Guild. I always enjoy learning from someone I know. I'm sorry I had to miss out.

Video Equipment Decision

For the February meeting with speaker Rob Appell we will again be trying out the video camera we are considering purchasing. At the November meeting, the video that the afternoon attendees saw was not as good as it could have been. Between meetings we changed the lighting to use spotlights to light to platform and the image was greatly improved. We decided to try this equipment again so that everyone could see the improvement. Kent Audio Visual, who owns the equipment we are using, provided the following estimate for purchase of new equipment:

Panasonic AG-AC HD Camera	\$1499.00
Fluid Drag Video Tripod	\$ 395.00
HDMI 50' Cable	\$ 60.99
AV Pro70m Extender and Receiver Set	\$ 299.99
Cable HDMI 6'	\$ 28.00
Labor – Training	<u>\$ 185.00</u>
Total before tax	\$2467.00

We believe this to be the maximum amount as we don't believe we need more training. We could possibly find a less expensive tripod, etc. Setup of the equipment is not difficult (plug in power and run cables between camera and projector). Operation of the camera is very easy...pointing the camera on the tripod and zooming in and out. This equipment can also be used at the Sr. Center and also at the Quilt Show (Mini Auction?).

Purchases not budgeted over \$1000 requires approval of the membership, so at the end of each meeting, we will be asking you to approve or disapprove purchasing the equipment.



Triangle Frenzy

“Tri” It, You’ll Like It!

“Tri”ed & True

Block 5


Directions: Cut 8—4” squares—Background fabric

Cut 6—4” squares—Fabric A

Cut 1—4” square—Fabric B

Cut 1—4” square—Fabric C

Draw a diagonal line on light Fabric. Place 1 light fabric & 1 color (dark) fabric right sides together (RST). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ ” on each side of diagonal line. Cut on diagonal line. Trim to 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ”. Press seams open. Make 16 half-square triangles.



Special notes:

*The finished layout & yardage needed can be found in the October or November Newsletter.

CORRECTION: Yardage for setting triangles & pinwheel background is 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ yds.(4 yds. total background fabric) If you wish to make the setting triangles a different color, the yardage needed for setting triangles is 1 $\frac{1}{3}$ yds.

*Directions for setting & finishing quilt will be given in a future newsletter.


*I found that pressing the seams open worked best.

* You may easily vary the size of the blocks by making the half-square triangles a different size. (2” HST would make an 8” block)

Get Your Beads On!

Starting at the February guild meeting, there will be special seating in the front for anyone who has entered at least one quilt in the show and is wearing their quilt show entry beads!

How do you get your quilt show entry beads? Bring your completed quilt show entry form and a 4" x 6" photo of your quilt to the quilt show entry table at our February and March meetings. If you want to have your quilt judged, you will also need to bring a \$10 fee for each judged entry. You will receive one strand of beads for each of your entries. Look for our table with the Heart balloon (General entries) and Star balloon (Judged entries). We will be at both meetings but will only be staying through the break at the evening meeting.

We are at 10% of our quilt entry goal with only two months until the March 13 entry deadline. Please help us make the 2018 Common Threads Regional Quilt Show one of our best shows by entering up to 5 quilts total per person!

General entry quilts may be any age but must not have hung in our show before. They are for exhibit only.

Judged entry quilts must have been made by you and finished after January 1, 2016. They will be judged by a certified quilt judge.

The Quilt Shop Navigator is a handy directory of quilt shops throughout the Midwest (from Kansas and Missouri north) and quilting events such as shop hops and quilt shows nationwide and in Canada. It's a great reference for travelers who might want to do some shopping or see great quilts while on the road. Issues are printed for different regions, with two editions each year – January-June and July-December.

The Common Threads Regional Quilt Show opportunity quilt is featured on the cover of the January-June 2018 issue. In addition to having our lovely opportunity quilt on the cover, Prairie Quilt Guild is featured in a write-up on the first page of the book, and we have a color ad on page 66 promoting the show. 

Charity Quilts

Hello! Thank you for welcoming me to the Quilt Guild (I joined several months ago) and for your encouragement in chairing the Charity quilt committee. It was overwhelming at first, but I think I've got it under control now.

One of the changes I've made is in regards to the kits available to be checked out for construction. Each kit available will have an information sheet with it that gives some details about what's included in the kit, the suggested pattern (feel free to get creative!) and approximate size. These info sheets are also color coded:



Pink – for kits that need to be pieced.

Yellow – for quilts that are ready to be quilted. The top and back will be included (sometimes the binding too).

Blue – the quilt has been assembled and is ready for binding.

This way, if you have a particular part of a quilt that you specialize in, you can easily peruse and choose a kit to check out and work on. The check-out sheet has also been updated and color coded. Hopefully it is more intuitive to complete.

I hope that you will stop by and visit the charity quilt table. If you don't have time to check out a kit this time, maybe you will be inspired to do so next time.

2018 Birthday Block

Every block you make enters you in the drawing to win a batch of blocks to make your own creations!

Cut:

Blocks: 5" X 5" sq qty-4 same material

Ribbon: 1 1/2" X 5" qty-2 same material

1 1/2" X 10 1/2" qty -1 (horizontal strip)

Bow: 2 1/2" X 2 1/2" qty-2 same material as ribbon

Top sashing: tone on tone

2 1/2" X 4 1/2" rectangle qty-1 (flying geese for bow)

2 1/2" X 3 1/2" qty -2 (each side of geese assembly)

Side sashing: 2 1/2" X 12 1/2" qty -1 tone on tone same material as top sashing. LEFT side of completed block.

Sew 2-5" sq to ribbon (1 1/2" X 5") Press and repeat. Sew 10 1/2" to block connecting horizontal.

Bow assembly: 4 1/2" rectangle to make flying geese.

2 1/2" X 2 1/2" mark diagonal and sew to rectangle press back and trim to 1/8"

Repeat with the other 2 1/2" X 2 1/2" sq to finish flying geese.

Sew flying geese assembly to 2 1/2" X 3 1/2". On each side of geese. Sew to top assembly.

Sew 2 1/2" X 12 1/2" sashing To LEFT side of block assembly.

It only takes 30 minutes to complete a block.

Hint: Trim all salvages and use clean fabrics.




