## December 2019 Program

### Deborah Divine

Deborah Divine's topic for December is **Rose Kretsinger**, Quilter, Artist, Author (1886-1963) who was a nationally famous 20th century quilter from Emporia, Kansas.



Deborah combines two of her loves, quilting and research, into an historic characterization of Rose Kretsinger. Rose shared her knowledge and love of quilting in part through her co-authorship of the highly acclaimed *Romance of the Patchwork Quilt*. She is in the Quilter's Hall of Fame and has two quilts in the Top 100 Quilts of the 20th Century. Deborah continues Rose's love of sharing her quilting, philosophy and techniques, as well as appreciation for the time in which she lived, with her portrayal of Rose. Deborah has spent much of her professional career conducting research and sharing her results in both the public and private sectors. She was named one of the top 50 researchers on the University of Florida research faculty in 1986. She served as Program Manager for the Kansas Scenic Byways Program for 13 years. During that time she sponsored numerous conferences and workshops, one of which was "Ride Into History" by Drs. Joyce Thierer and Ann Birney, which proved to be an "I can do that" moment for her. She has conducted extensive research not only about Rose, but also the place and times in which she lived. She is grateful to Rose's family, other quilt researchers, the Lyon County Historical Society, and the Spencer Museum at the University of Kansas, which is the repository for Rose's quilts and quilting tools for their assistance in her research.






## PQG Opportunity Quilt




# 2019-2020 Block of the Month - December 2019

## Kansas Theme Block #3 Railroad Block




### Railroad Block

Cut 1-4 inch square brown (dark color) and 1-4 inch square white.  
Cut across each square diagonally to make two triangles of each color.  
Lay a dark triangle on a white triangle, sewing across the long edge. Iron seam open in back. Make two [Half Square Triangles](#), trimming them back to 3 ½ inches.  
Cut 2 inch strip (8½" long) of background and 2 inch strip of yellow (light color).  
Sew these strips together lengthwise. Iron seam open in back.  
Cut this combined strip into 2 inch wide pieces.  
Sew one piece to another with opposite colors matching, to form two squares.  
Iron seam open in back. Make sure these [Four-Patches](#) measure out to 3 ½ inches.  
Sew one Half Square Triangle to the [Four-Patch](#), with the darker triangle in upper right top row and lower left bottom row. The Four-Patch design should have the yellow (light color) starting in the upper left corner and ending in the lower right corner.  
Sew these two pieces together to get the design listed above. Iron out seam. Trim square to 6 ½ inches.



### Churn Dash Design for border of above square

Cut 4 strips of 2"x 6 ½" for the orange (dark color) of border.  
Cut 4 strips of 2"x 6 ½" for white (or beige) of border.  
Cut two 3 7/8" white squares (light color) and two 3 7/8" squares brown (dark color) for corners of border.  
Place a white square on brown square and draw line from one corner to opposite corner diagonally. Sew a ¼ inch seam on each side of this line. Cut down the drawn line to make two squares, one side white triangle shape and one side brown triangle shape. Do this step twice to form four sets of white/brown Half Square Triangles.  
Sew an orange (dark color) and white strip together lengthwise. Do this for each orange/white combination.  
Sew one combo strip to the left side of the Railroad block and another to the right side of the Railroad block, making sure the orange (dark color border) is next to the Railroad block.  
Sew a brown/white square to the right side of an orange/white combo strip (orange side down), making sure the dark triangle is next to the strip and sew the other brown/white square to the other end, dark triangle next to the strip.  
Sew this piece to the top side of your Railroad block.  
Sew the last two brown/white squares to the combo strip, orange side up this time and the brown triangles facing into the combo strip. Attached this piece to the bottom of your Railroad block, making sure the orange strip is next to the Railroad block center. See side picture. Block should measure 12 ½ inch when completed.



## Sara's String of Friends

I would like to follow in the footsteps of some former presidents and make a friendship quilt. I would be pleased if you made a block for me. The block I've chosen is the Chandelier Beads Block. It is perhaps a simplified nine patch!

The colors are neutral (white or off-white), yellow/gold/orange, and indigo. You may choose solids or prints. If choosing prints, please choose those that will read as the colors named.

I will have a basket to collect blocks at the December, January, and February meetings. I will also have a pen for you to sign your block. Many thanks for sharing in my memories of PQG!

Cut . . .

A: one 3 ½" square of neutral (white or off-white)

B: two 2" squares of yellow/gold/orange

C: two rectangles (2" X 3 ½") of indigo

D: two rectangles (2" X 5") of indigo

Sew . . .

2" squares to the longer rectangles (B + D), pressing to the dark


Shorter rectangles on either side of the neutral square (C + A + C),  
pressing to the dark

Rows together as shown, pressing to the dark

Your block should be 6 ½"

Please sign your block with a black pigma pen

Please note that the block will be set on point.

## 2020 Birthday Block

### SunFlower Block



Brown 1- 5X5" Sq  
Yellow 8- 2 3/4" Sq  
Blue 4- 2 3/4" Sq  
4- 2 3/4 X 5"

Finish size= 9.5" X 9.5"

Assemble Flying Geese Unit

Mark all yellow squares with diagonal sewing line.  
Sew on line onto 2 3/4" X 5" blue. Press and trim  
Repeat on the other end.

On 2 of the Flying Geese units sew 1Blue Sq on each end.  
Sew 2 Flying Geese units to each side of 5X5 brown  
Attach Flying Geese Unit with Blue squares on opposite end.

Blocks need to be turned in by May 12, 2020  
Drawing June 6 at our Birthday celebration.


