2020 Birthday Block

SunFlower Block



Brown 1- 5X5" Sq
Yellow 8- 2 3/4" Sq
Blue 4- 2 3/4" Sq
4- 2 3/4 X 5"

Finish size= 9.5" X 9.5"

Assemble Flying Geese Unit

Mark all yellow squares with diagonal sewing line.
Sew on line onto 2 3/4" X 5" blue. Press and trim
Repeat on the other end.

On 2 of the Flying Geese units sew 1 Blue Sq on each end.
Sew 2 Flying Geese units to each side of 5X5 brown
Attach Flying Geese Unit with Blue squares on opposite end.

Blocks need to be turned in by May 12, 2020

2020 Summer Kid's Camps are cancelled.

Due to the Covid-19 virus, the uncertainty of reopening businesses, and not knowing when larger gatherings will be allowed, the Community Camps committee feels that cancellation of both of this summer's camps are necessary for the health/safety of sponsors and campers alike.

Although we had secured the use of the excellent facilities at Ascension Lutheran Church, we realized that we would not be able to comply with the social distancing policy with so many of us in the same room and using the shared equipment throughout the day.

2019-2020 Block of the Month - June 2020

Kansas Theme Block #9 Kansas Troubles

Kansas Troubles is a very old pattern associated with the challenges and difficulties of settlers in Kansas. The block is typically made with red in it to symbolize “bleeding Kansas” to represent the border wars between Kansas and Missouri. You may stick with your three-color theme for this block or incorporate the red triangle in place of your usual dark color. This 6½ inch block will be finished with the Churn Dash design border.

From white (light) background fabric cut 2- 3 7/8 inch squares, cutting each diagonally across to form 4 large triangles. Then cut 8- 1 5/8 inch squares and 4- 1¼ inch square.

From brown (darker color) or if using red, cut 2- 2 3/8 inch squares, cutting these diagonally to form 4 small triangles.

From gold (lighter color), cut 12- 1 5/8 inch squares. Use 4 of these squares to cut across diagonally

to form 8 gold triangles.

For layout of your fabrics, visualize the 6½ square being divided into four equal parts. Lay your large white triangles in a windmill pattern, with the upper right facing long edge up, upper left facing long edge angled left and downward, lower left triangle facing right and downward and lower right with longer edge facing upward. Place the small (1¼”) white (background fabric) square in the opposite corner of each quarter section, opposite the longer edge of the white large triangle. The brown (or if you chose red) small triangle will sit on the longer edge of the large white triangle, with its point touching the point of the small white triangle. (Points will overlap.)

For the finishing pieces, you will need to lay a 1 5/8 inch gold square on top of the 1 5/8 inch white square and draw a line diagonally across the back. Sew your scant ¼ inch seam along each side of this drawn line. Cut down the line after both seams have been sewn to reveal two new squares, part white/gold. Do this to the remaining white and gold 1 5/8 inch squares to get total of 16 white/gold squares. Trim each to 1¼ inch square.






Place the white/gold squares in this pattern for each quarter section of your 6½ inch block: Look at your right upper section, place a white/gold square with the gold edge to each side of your small (1¼ inch) white square in the corner. Place another white/gold square alongside the previous set white/gold square so that the saw-toothed edge faces the same direction as the previous combo square. Lastly, place the gold triangle cut above on each edge with the longer side of the gold triangle flush with the large white triangle longer edge. Now sew together the pieces. Sew the upper row of white square, two combo squares, and gold triangle together as a row. Then sew together the two combo triangles and small gold triangle that were laid up/down.

Take this last 3-piece unit and sew it to one edge of your brown (or red) triangle. Press the seam towards the brown (red) triangle. Sew the 4-piece upper row to the other edge of your brown (red) triangle edge. Press the seam towards the brown triangle. Lay this piece down and lay the large white triangle on top. Trim the excess so that both large triangles are the same size. Sew along the longer edge to form a square 3½ by 3½. Complete the other units to look just like your first unit.

Lay the 4- 3½ inch squares back out on your table, making sure the originally windmill design of your white triangles are still in place, facing the directions listed above. Now sew your upper two squares together and lower two squares together. Finish by sewing the two rows together. You should finish with a 6½ inch quilt square - Kansas Troubles!

Border: Churn Dash Design

Your center 6½ inch square will be completed with the border shown in October and November. Refer to these months for instructions to complete your block, finishing with a 12 ½ inch block. Thanks for staying with this project.


