Lori Lee Triplett, Business Manager for Quilt and Textile Collections, has successfully combined a variety of passions which include research, writing, and performing into the quilt world. As a lecturer and instructor she brings her experience from stage, screen, and radio to make the presentations fun yet educational. She enjoys presenting at local quilt guilds, but also presents at national conferences and has made appearances internationally.

As an award winning writer, Lori has written more than 15 books and numerous magazine articles.

Indigo Quilts, which covers the history of indigo from Africa to America was a winner of the Lucy Hilty Research Grant and the Meredith Scholar Award. The fourth quilt book Pioneer Quilts, was so successful it is now only available as an e-book or POD. Preliminary work for the fifth quilt book was awarded the H. Mark Dunn Research Grant and the Lucy Hilty Research Grant.

An art quilter, Lori prefers to work with hand dyed or hand painted fabric to create. Her art work has been featured in multiple exhibitions, websites, publications, and books. Her art can be found in private and corporate collections, as well as museums. She is an international award winning artist including from the National Endowment for the Arts: American Masterpiece. In 2018 she received the ARTSKC: Inspiration Grant for a community art project using quilted panels to decorate a playground fence in the inner city. She is currently creating quilts for two solo quilt exhibitions: Tree of Life and Indigo Images.

E.W. MARLAND MANSION


The Marland Mansion is a 43,561 sq. ft. magnificent mansion that is one of the largest residences in the southwestern United States and is known as the "Palace on the Prairie." The mansion took three years to construct, 1925 to 1928. The mansion designed by master architect John Duncan Forsyth, along with artists, decorators, and sculptors of international reputation. It measures 78 feet wide and 184 ft. long. It has 55 rooms, including 10 bedrooms, 12 bathrooms, 7 fireplaces, and 3 kitchens. In 1973 the mansion was designated as a National Historic Landmark and is now a museum open to the public.

SunFlower Block



Brown 1- 5X5" Sq
Yellow 8- 2 3/4" Sq
Blue 4- 2 3/4" Sq
4- 2 3/4 X 5"

Finish size= 9.5" X 9.5"

Assemble Flying Geese Unit

Mark all yellow squares with diagonal sewing line.
Sew on line onto 2 3/4" X 5" blue. Press and trim
Repeat on the other end.

On 2 of the Flying Geese units sew 1Blue Sq on each end.
Sew 2 Flying Geese units to each side of 5X5 brown
Attach Flying Geese Unit with Blue squares on opposite end.

Blocks need to be turned in by May 12, 2020

2019-2020 Block of the Month - July 2020

Kansas Theme Block #10 Sunflower Block

What is more appropriate for our Kansas based theme than the Sunflower, the Kansas

State Flower. It can be seen driving along the roads in Kansas, growing wildly in the ditches and even large production of the tall sunflowers along fields near Concordia and Lawrence. What a sight to see! Even Goodland, Kansas is known as the Sunflower

Capital of the Sunflower State. There is an 80 foot display of the Vincent van Gogh sunflower located there. Have fun creating your Kansas Sunflower.

From your white background fabric, cut **twelve**- 1½ inch squares. **Set 4 aside** and draw a line diagonally across the back of the other 8 squares. Cut **four**- 1½ by 2½ inch rectangles.

From your brown, or darker color, cut **four**-1½ inch squares and **one**-2½ inch square. From your gold, or lighter color, cut **four**-1 inch squares and draw a line diagonally across the back and cut **eight**-1½ by 2½ inch rectangles.

To complete the petals to your flower, take a gold rectangle out and place a white 1½ inch square right sides together to the upper left corner. Sew across drawn line. Fold back the triangle, iron and then trim the excess off the back. Do this step to each gold rectangle. All should be complete with a small white triangle in left upper corner.

To complete the center, take out the brown 2½ inch square and place a gold 1 inch square, right sides together, on each corner. Sew along the drawn line on the back of the gold square. Fold back the triangle, iron and then trim the excess off the back. Place this in the center of your block.

Sew a brown 1½ inch square and white 1½ inch squares together. Sew a white rectangle to the long edge of this brown/white combo. Trim these to 2½ inch square unit. Make 4.

Sew 2 petals together (longer edge together with the white triangle on left upper corner of each rectangle). Repeat to make 4 sets.

Layout your block: Place the brown 2½ inch square with gold corners in the center.








Place a petal pair on each side of your brown square, with points out. In each corner, place brown and white combo unit, with brown square to the center.

Now sew the three units on each row together. Iron upper row and bottom row with

seams toward the center and your middle row with seams outward. Sew your top and middle row together, iron upward. Sew bottom row to this piece, ironing seam downward. Completed block should be 6½ inches square.

Churndash Design for border to above square. Refer to October thru January months for instructions on completing your 6½ inch square with the Churndash border.

Your completed block should measure 12½ inch square. Great job everyone!
